# Introduction

Is there anything unique about being a woman? What does God's Word say to women today?

Two themes run in parallel through Scripture. Equal dignity. Significant difference. Women are badly served when their essential dignity as human beings is disrespected. But they are also badly served when 'equality' is assumed to mean 'sameness'. That is probably why, when a survey of women in the UK was conducted in 2018, the majority of those surveyed *affirmed* female equality, but refused to identify as feminist.<sup>1</sup> Similar results were found in other European countries, and also the US. All too often feminism has cheered for equality, but failed to take sufficient account of difference.

I first wrote *God's Design for Women* in 2002. I have rewritten the book to take account of current cultural trends, including the ever-increasing confusion about gender 'identity'. I have also extended the scope to include what is happening beyond my own country.
